IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED as follows:	
[Respondent or Petitioner]	(Member) and [Respondent or
Petitioner] (Former Spe	ouse) have acquired a community interest in the
Member's monthly retirement benefits administered	by the Marin County Employees' Retirement
Association ("Association") and attributable to perio	ds of service in the Association from the Date
of Marriage up to the Date of Separation or date of R	Retirement, whichever occurs first. Member
and Former Spouse intend, by this Stipulation and O	order, to divide and allocate their community
property interest in the retirement plan in conforman	ce with State law and with the lawful
provisions of the Association.	
2. The Member is currently receiving retires	ment benefits of \$ For purposes of

this Order, the term "retirement benefits" shall include any service retirement benefits, any service

connected disability retirement benefits, any non-service connected disability retirement benefits, but shall exclude any reimbursement for Medicare premiums. Upon dissolution of the marriage, the Former Spouse ceases to qualify for unmodified survivor benefits pursuant to sections 31760.1 or 31760.2 of the Government Code or otherwise.

- 3. Former spouse shall be awarded an interest in Member's retirement benefits calculated as follows: \_e.g. 50%\_ of the monthly retirement benefits attributable to the Member's service in the Association during the period from the Date of Marriage up to the Date of Separation as the Former Spouse's sole and separate property. All retirement benefits which are not awarded to the former spouse pursuant to this Order shall be the Member's sole and separate property. Member and Former Spouse agree that the date of marriage was \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ and the date of separation was \_\_\_\_\_\_ (OR describe other agreed upon manner in which retirement benefits are to be divided.)
- 4. The Former spouse shall commence to receive his/her monthly benefit by separate payment directly from the Association as soon as administratively practicable after receipt of an acceptable Order.
- 5. Upon the Member's death, the Administrator shall cease paying the Former Spouse a monthly benefit. (The Order may provide that if the Member has remarried or has minor child(ren) who are eligible for monthly survivor benefits pursuant to sections 31760.2, 31785.1 or 31786.1 of the Government Code, then a portion of that survivor benefit may be allocated to the Former Spouse until the Member's beneficiary is no longer eligible for such continuance, in accordance with *In re Marriage of Carnall* (1989) 216 Cal. App.3d 1010.) If there is no surviving spouse or minor child(ren) the Administrator shall pay to the beneficiary designated by Member the balance of any accumulated retirement contributions and interest remaining in the Member's account, if any.
- 6. Upon the Former Spouse's death, the Administrator shall continue to pay the Former Spouse's monthly benefit directly to the beneficiary designated by the Former spouse, provided benefits are still payable to the Member at the time of the Former Spouse's death. Such payments shall cease upon the death of the Member. If the designated beneficiary does not survive the Former Spouse and a successor beneficiary has not been nominated by the Former Spouse, the

monthly benefit shall be paid to the individual(s) named as beneficiary(ies) of the estate of the Former Spouse, or as ordered by this court if there is no estate or the estate has been closed, until the death of the Member in accordance with *In re Marriage of Powers* (1990) 218 Cal.App.3d 626.

- 7. As a condition for the entry of this Order, Member and Former Spouse understand and agree that those provisions contained in sections 31760.1, 31760.2, 31785, 31785.1, 31786, and 31786.1 of the Government Code shall not be applicable upon the death of either the Member or the Former Spouse unless otherwise specified herein.
- 8. Each party shall be responsible for and pay any taxes due in connection with his or her receipt of distributions from the Association. Member hereby authorizes the Association to release such information to Former Spouse as necessary so that each party may determine taxable and non-taxable portions of any benefit paid by virtue of this Order.
- 9. The Association shall not be required by the terms of this Stipulation/Order: 1) to provide any type or form of benefit or option not otherwise provided under Member's retirement plan; 2) to increase the amount of any benefits provided under said plan; or 3) to suffer any additional burden beyond the requirements specifically set forth in the County Employees Retirement Law of 1937 (Cal. Gov. Code secs. 31450 et seq.) as modified by the California Public Employees' Pension Reform Act of 2013 (Cal. Gov. Code sec. 7522).
- 10. It is further ORDERED that the Member shall act as constructive trustee of any benefits assigned to the Former Spouse that may be paid to or received by the Member. The Member, as trustee, shall promptly pay or transmit any such benefits to the Former Spouse at the Former Spouse's last known address. It is also ORDERED that the Former Spouse shall act as constructive trustee of any benefits assigned to the Member under this Order that may be paid to or received by the Former spouse. The Former Spouse, as trustee, shall promptly pay or transmit any such benefits to the Member at the member's last known address.
- 11. Attorneys' fees will not be sought against the Association (Family Code section 2030, subd. (a)(1)), and the parties hereto agree that the Association is a governmental entity within the meaning of that section.
